

WHO VS WHOM

"Who" is used to refer to the subject while "whom" is used to refer to the object.

To easily distinguish them, answer the question using a pronoun. If the question requires an answer with a subject pronoun (ex. she, he, they), use "who," if it requires an object pronoun (ex. her, him, them), use "whom."



Who is reading by the window?

She is reading by the window.

Whom is she writing to?

She is writing to **her**.



Who likes to do yoga?

She likes to do yoga.



Whom did you ask to revise your paper?

I asked **her** to revise my paper.
