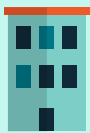


Distinguishing pronouns: **It vs They**

“It” is used to refer to singular non-human things (i.e. places, animals, abstract concepts), weather and time of day.

It is beautiful.

The building is beautiful.



Love is beautiful.



The cat is beautiful.



Remember: In English, the subject can never be omitted. You cannot say, "is beautiful." You need a noun or pronoun. "I have a new car. **It** is beautiful."

“They” is used to refer to all plural third person subjects.

This means "they" can be used to refer to the pronouns "he," "she," and "it" in plural form.

They are beautiful.



The women are beautiful.

The buildings are beautiful.



The cats are beautiful.



The men are beautiful.



Your words are beautiful.



My friends are beautiful.
