



This verb means "**to place** something somewhere." It is a transitive verb and, therefore, requires a <u>direct</u> <u>object</u> after the verb.



He **lays** <u>the books</u> on the table.



This verb means "**to recline** oneself somewhere." It is an intransitive verb and, therefore, it does not take a direct object.



Their cat **lies** on top of the books.

<u>Note</u>: *To lie* can also mean "**to say** something that is **not true**." These two verbs have different conjugations.
