



#### Why is writing in active voice important?

#### Why is writing in active voice important?

 It is crucial as it fosters a sense of individuality and selfexpression, essential for academic and personal growth. It enhances students' ability to communicate ideas clearly and persuasively, a vital skill in both educational and professional settings. Additionally, a distinct writing voice helps students stand out in their assignments and writing, reflecting their unique perspectives and thought processes.

#### **Active Voice Benefits**

- It clearly identifies the action and who
  is performing it, making sentences
  straightforward and easy to understand.
  This is particularly useful in
  instructional and technical writing,
  where clarity is paramount.
- Beneficial in academic writing, technical documents, and journalism, where conveying information accurately and unambiguously is crucial.

- It creates engaging and dynamic sentences. This is because active voice tends to make statements more forceful and assertive, which can be more compelling for the reader.
- It is effective in persuasive writing, advertising, and storytelling, where keeping the reader's attention and interest is key.

#### **Active Voice Benefits**

 Active voice generally leads to concise sentences. It often eliminates unnecessary words that passive voice constructions typically include, making the writing more succinct and to the point.

 Writing in active voice tends to improve the flow of text, making it readable and easier to follow. This is particularly beneficial in educational materials and documents intended for a wide audience, where maintaining reader interest and understanding is crucial.

# Advantages of Using Active Voice

- Clarity: Active voice identifies the subject performing the action, making sentences direct and easier to understand.
- Conciseness: Active voice often uses fewer words than passive voice, resulting in concise and straightforward sentences.



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# **Disadvantages** of Passive Voice

 Confusing for Readers: Passive voice can obscure who is performing the action in a sentence. It makes it difficult for undergraduate students to understand the meaning or who is responsible for an action.

# Advantages of Using Active Voice

 Engagement: Active voice is dynamic and engaging for readers, making the writing livelier and interesting.



# **Disadvantages** of Passive Voice

 Weakens Argumentation: passive voice can weaken the persuasiveness of an argument. It tends to make statements less forceful and assertive. This is not ideal for undergraduates aiming to present strong, clear arguments in their essays or papers.



### Structure

#### Active voice follows this structure:



**Notice:** Only sentences with active voice can have direct objects. This is because in the passive voice, the subject receives the action.

## Examples

#### Let's see...

#### → Active voice:

The student discusses her research paper.
 subject verb

#### → Passive voice:

The research paper is being discussed by the student subject

verb
indirect object

#### **Examples**

María skies at the ice rink.

subject verb Prepositional Phrase



Juan plays the guitar.

Lola, the dog, eats her food.

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### Let's Review

#### **Active Voice and Passive Voice**

Active Voice	Passive Voice
John won the gold medal.	The gold medal was won by John.
The tutor revised my essay.	My essay was revised by the tutor.
My mother remodeled her house.	The house was remodeled by my mother.

Observe that the active voice sentence is direct and concise. Pay attention to the grammar differences and verb tenses.

#### Understand Active vs. Passive Voice.

In active voice, the subject of the sentence performs the action expressed by the verb.

For example, "The researcher conducted the experiment."

In contrast, passive voice places the subject at the end, like "The experiment was conducted by the researcher."

Active voice is generally direct and vigorous.

#### Final Advice

- Recognize the importance of clarity in your college writing. Active voice
  typically makes students' sentences clearer and more straightforward. This
  is crucial in academic writing, where complex ideas need to be conveyed as
  clearly as possible.
- Use active voice to emphasize the subject at hand. Active voice allows the student to highlight the doer of the action, making the writing statements assertive and its arguments compelling.
